- 838 JAMES ANDERSON filius natu 2<sup>dus</sup> Magistri Gulielmi Anderson Hist: Ecc. P. in Academia Glasguensi.  
Brother of 755.
- 839 JAMES SIMSON filius Viri R<sup>ndi</sup> Joannis Simson Nuper in hac Academia S.S.T.P.
- 840 JOHN DALRYMPLE filius Natu maximus Gulielmi Dalrymple Advocati in Urbe Edinburgense et Nepos Joannis Dalrymple de Cranstoun Equitis Baronetti.  
Sir John Dalrymple, fourth Bart. of Cranstoun, succeeding his father in 1771. Born 1726. Advocate, 1748. Solicitor to the Board of Excise. One of the Barons of the Scottish Court of Exchequer, 1776-1807. Died 26th February, 1810. Brother of 1936.
- 841 JOHN DOUGALL filius natu maximus Thomæ Dougall quondam Chirurgi Glasguensis.
- 842 JOHN EASSON filius Joannis Easson Scribæ Glasguensis.
- 843 JOHN POLLOK frater natu 3<sup>tus</sup> prædicti Roberti Pollock Equitis Baronetti.  
Of Balgray. Captain in the Army. Killed at the battle of Fontenoy, 1745. Brother of 330, 835.
- 844 JOHN ROSSE filius natu minimus Magistri Andreæ Rosse Exprofessoris H. L. in Academia Glasguensi.  
M.A. 1754. Brother of 51, 74.
- 845 ROBERT AITOUN filius natu maximus Andreæ Aitoun Mercatoris, et nuper Consulis Glasguensis.
- 846 ROBERT HAMILTON filius natu 2<sup>dus</sup> Georgii Hamilton Mercatoris Glasguensis.
- 847 ROBERT HENDERSON filius viri Rev<sup>ndi</sup> Richardi Henderson V.D.M. in parochia de Blantyre in Com. Clydesdaliiæ.  
M.A. 1746. Elected one of the Exchequer Bursars. Died before 14th October, 1747. Brother of 1174, 1285.
- 848 ROBERT NEILSON filius Jacobi Neilson Mercatoris Glasguensis.
- 849 ROBERT STOBO filius Gulielmi Stobo quondam Mercatoris Glasguensis.  
Born at Glasgow, 1727. Sometime Merchant in Virginia, but in 1754 was appointed Captain in a Regiment raised by the Province to oppose the French. On surrender by Washington of Fort Necessity, was one of two hostages given to secure performance of the articles of capitulation. Was detected drawing plans of Fort Du Quesne, and closely imprisoned at Quebec. Escaped in 1756. Was captured and condemned to death as a spy, but the sentence was not approved by the King. Escaped again in 1757, and was recaptured. Once more escaped in 1758 in a birch-bark canoe, and, after 38 days' adventures, reached the British Army before Louisburg. Was made Major during captivity, and, after returning to Virginia, sailed in 1760 for England, where, in 1761, he was commissioned Captain in the 15th Foot. Served in the West Indies, 1762-67, when returned to England, and resigned in 1770. Died some little time thereafter.

Merchant in Glasgow. Died at Brownfield, 24th October, 1808, aged 80.

Of Netherplace. Died at Mauchline, 13th March, 1786. Father of 5540.

- 855 RICHARD HOLT filius V.R. Richardi Holt V.D.M. in Urbe Liverpoole in Com. Lancastriæ  
M.A. 1741. A Williams Scholar, and therefore intended for the Dissenting Ministry in "South Britain."

Otherwise Bedell Howard Stanford. M.A. 1743. Matriculated at Trinity College, Dublin, 1738. Of Caran, County Cavan. High Sheriff of (a) County Monaghan, 1754, (b) County Cavan, 1768. J.P. for latter County, 1759. Died in Dominick Street, Dublin, without issue, 11th March, 1776, aged 55.
- Nomina discipulorum Classis Ethicæ qui hoc anno Academiam Intrarunt sub præsidio Mag: Francisci Hutcheson.
- 857 GEORGE GWINN ex Parochia de Urney in Com: de Tyrone in Hib:  
Otherwise George Gwynn. M.A. 1744.
- 858 HU: GASTON ex parochia de Ballymenagh in Com. de Antrim in Hib:  
Irish Presbyterian Minister at Ballywillan, 1748-66. Died 15th October, 1766. His widow survived him for 57 years, during all which period she enjoyed the benefits of the Widows' Fund of the Synod of Ulster. Brother of 1615.
- 859 JOHN CARRE filius natu maximus Dom: Georgii Carre de Nisbit in Comitatu De Mers, sive Bervicensi.  
Of Nesbit. Died at Nesbit House, 11th January, 1784.
- 860 JOSEPH WILSON filius Francisci Wilson de Tully in Com: de Longford in Hib: Armig:  
Brother-in-law of Professor Francis Hutcheson; uncle of 753.
- 861 WILFRED TROUTBECK filius Jac: Troutbeck in parochia Dacre in Com. Cumberland in Angl:
- 862 AR: HAM: MAXWELL filius Jacobi Hamilton Maxwell de Drum in Com: de Down Armigeri.
- 863 EBEN: KELBURN Dublinensis filius Adami Kelburn ex Insula Bota in Scotia.  
M.A. 1743 as Ebenezer Kilburn. "Dublin Presbytery have ordained Mr. Ebenezer Killburn, but when not said" [Records of General Synod of Ulster, 1749]. A "Mr. Kilburn" died 27th October, 1776 [same Records, 1777].
